The Garden

How does your garden grow? At the Parkway Southwest Middle School (PSWM) garden, the answer is – with the help of lots of friends!

Four years ago, then vice principal of PSWM, Jill Loyette, had a seed of an idea. With the help of her family's business—Greenscape Gardens—the school would plant a garden and share the produce grown with Circle. A small corps of community volunteers—including Circle volunteers Jean Campbell and Larry Quick—and students took the dirt, seeds and supplies donated by Greenscape and turned a patch of school lawn into a simple garden patch. A small harvest was shared with Circle…and several deer who seemed to claim the plantings for themselves.

A few years went by. Whole seasons of very dry or very wet weather limited the production of tomatoes, peppers, greens and other wonderful vegetables. But, the school, students, volunteers, a deer-proof fence and Greenscape persisted.

Fast forward to the school year just past. Although Jill has moved to another school, the school's administrative assistant, Alexis Newsome, became the garden's new champion. Greenscape and volunteers continue to support the project, but the big story is that of the students. Among the most enthusiastic are the students who live in the city and attend PSWM. Many of these students have never had the opportunity to work with the land. They planted veggies that later made appearances on cafeteria plates. Alexis used allotted funds to bring the children to the garden this summer to help and to see the hundreds of pounds of food the garden has yielded so far. Greenscape gave each child a tomato plant to take home, and Alexis drove into St. Louis to deliver pots to plant them in.

Like vegetables work together to make a good salad, each partner works together to make the PSWM garden a thriving source of food for the school and Circle and a powerful outdoor classroom to teach young people the joys of a garden!
