INTRODUCTION

2016 was a year of strengthening our core programs and support for our clients. Key to this effort was an in-depth client survey conducted to more fully understand the factors that bring people to Circle Of Concern and to identify data-driven ways to better meet their needs.

The survey confirmed that the largest single group needing our services is single mothers with school-age children (65 % of households), followed by seniors and people with disabilities. It revealed the percentage of our clients who hold full-time jobs (57%), who are veterans or active duty (15%), and how many of our heads-of-household have at least some college education (59%). It even confirmed two things we strong suspected – chicken noodle soup is the hands-down favorite and the "healthy versus sugary" cereal split is right down the middle!

More importantly, though, it clarified some key impact points - nearly 90% of our clients reported that, thanks to Circle, they have greater access to fresh fruits and vegetables. And 94% either agree or strongly agree to the following statement, "The food I receive from the pantry allows me/my family to save money to put towards bills each month."

With this information from the survey – and much more – we have worked closely on ways to better structure our programs and our outreach to the community for support that is most meaningful to our clients. By asking the right questions, we can provide the right answers for families in need.

The year closed with eager anticipation for the milestone to come in 2017 our 50th year in service of west St. Louis County families.




