The Best Investment

Education is the key to opportunity. It's a ticket out of poverty. ~ George H.W. Bush

The common wisdom found in President Bush's quote and shared by esteemed leaders from

the beginning of civilization-that education provides the surest path out of poverty-has guided Circle of Concern's Scholarship program since at least 1968.

This program is beloved. It has fueled the hopes and advanced the dreams of more than a thousand young people and adult clients over the years. A long-ago flood destroyed some early archives, but we know that Circle has invested far more than \$1 million in post-secondary education over the years.

Where do our scholars study? In recent years, scholarship recipients have attended universities as far ranging as Northeastern in Boston, Northwestern in Chicago and Southern Methodist in Dallas. Most attend much closer to

home, at Mizzou, St. Louis Community College, Rankin Technical College, Maryville and beyond. Adult clients have raised their income potential through college courses, professional certification and testing programs and by earning their GEDs. No matter where they go, our scholarships have helped keep their eyes on the prize.

Awarding a scholarship is one thing. Knowing that award is having a lasting, quantifiable impact is another. We recently reviewed data from years of scholarship recipients, and we are happy to report that our students take their educations-and their dreams-very seriously. According to Circle's Executive Director, Cyndi Miller, "We found that 54-58 percent of our scholars graduate, compared to 53 percent nationally. Also, while the national average grade point average (GPA) is 3.15, our scholars' GPAs average 3.6!"

Feeding Families is Just the Beginning

A Note from Cyndi

Recently, our staff had the unique opportunity to participate virtually in the largest national gathering of hunger advocates. Feeding America and Food Research and Action Center (FRAC) jointly hosted the National Anti-Hunger Policy Conference in Washington, D.C. in March.

We gained new perspectives on "food deserts," child hunger, the root causes of hunger, the challenges of serving those in rural America, and other hunger issues. There were a number of sessions related to SNAP - the Supplementary Nutritional Assistance Program, often referred to as "food stamps."

At Circle, we understand how SNAP helps our client families. What we don't often think about is the economic impact of SNAP. Not only does the program help to boost nearly 40 million Americans out of poverty, it contributes greatly to local economies. For every dollar spent on the program, \$1.50 to \$1.80 is generated in economic activity. For every \$billion spent, 9,000 – 17,000 jobs are created. Finally, of every \$1 spent, 15 cents goes to a farmer.

Another takeaway from the event was one advocate's plea to those who need food assistance, but fear the perceived stigma tied to the program. He says, "SNAP is not welfare. It is a *nutrition program...*" designed to help seniors, children and veterans, and others who are struggling. The program increases access to healthy, fresh foods – so critical to the health and wellbeing of all.

Miller adds, "With these investments, we anticipate that our student graduation rates will climb even higher than they are now."

Far from a handout, a Circle scholarship offers a true hand-up for a serious student – the opportunity to follow a dream. "Our goal is to help these truly exceptional students to complete their education and to gain stable, sustaining employment," says Miller.
