"Our client had just gotten a new job but was struggling in a vicious cycle. A full day at work, couldn't get her children into after-school care. Was trying to manage all the pieces of life." At that moment, Nancy says, our volunteers have a special job to do. "Volunteers do so much more than deliver groceries at that moment. They see clients that have so much on their plates, and we can help make that plate a little less crowded."

Nancy remembers the long, deep breath that woman took in response to the suggestion that she "just sit here and relax while we get your groceries." And Nancy recognizes that our clients can relax with us because of the kind, compassionate volunteers who work here.

On any given day, we have skilled and committed individuals come through our doors and put their experience to work for our clients. New Staff Members


Please join us in welcoming new staff to Circle!
