BUDdy System

Martin* struggled to find a job with a future. He joined Circle of Concern's Mentorship program, hoping for help finding job prospects and places to apply. Help is exactly what he got.

Through his mentor, Martin discovered BUD, or Building Union Diversity, a union construction pre-apprenticeship program that prepares qualified individuals for union jobs in the building trades. A six-week training course, support and the chance to certify as a union builder offered a path to a solid secure future for Martin and his family.

Circle's Mentorship program launched with a simple idea - enlist community volunteers to pair with Circle clients to help them get good jobs. Together, the pair might write a resume, fill out online job applications and practice interviews. While that's at the core of mentorship, the relationships formed have become much more fruitful than that. Today, mentors serve as career and connection coaches for clients who are climbing more than one hill to achieve stability and success.

One client - Katie* - just completed her Master's degree in the healthcare field but has been hampered in finding a job by her commitment to care for her chronically ill mother. Before she could take a job at a local hospital, Katie needed a specific training. With no money for the training, Katie's mentor connected her with the St. Louis Agency on Training & Employment, or SLATE, which offered her a scholarship to pay for it. Further, her mentor found resources to get Katie certified as a part-time caregiver for her mother, which supplemented her income.

Sometimes, getting hired is just one challenge. Bob* is 65 and was having trouble finding a job. He lives in a small home he inherited from family, but delinguent property taxes put him underwater. Selling the house wouldn't bring enough money to pay the taxes and pay rent somewhere else. His mentor stepped up. She connected him to a local nonprofit agency that

Circle will purchase a supply of both diapers and period products quarterly – at wholesale prices – from the Diaper Bank. This partnership won't satisfy our inventory needs fully, *but it will help greatly!*

And Martin? He completed his initial training at BUD and has already found full-time employment. He will continue to build his construction skills and credits his mentor for opening the path to a new life for his family.


