American money man, Warren Buffet, once said, "Someone's sitting in the shade today because someone planted a tree a long time ago." January seems like a good time to take that long view at what's ahead.

As this new year begins, planning certainly is at the heart of activity here at Circle. Taking the time to lay out the year's activities now means the food pantry will be better equipped in 2024 to service the roughly 650 families that walk through our door. It means our garden will be planted in time to produce more than 1,500 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables for our clients starting in May. Families will be ready to enroll their children in camp and plan for school. Our board will decide on a budget that assures good stewardship of our funds and a sustainable way to live our mission far into the future.

January is good time for all of us to take stock of our financial landscape and map out the road ahead. For that reason, Circle is partnering with FreeWill.com to assist our friends and donors with tools to make good decisions about their money today and in the future. And, yes, we're hopeful the tools might lead you to include Circle of Concern in some of those plans! Folded into this newsletter is a Permanent Giving Guide that we hope you'll hold onto to help you put your assets to work in ways that take care of your loved ones, meet your financial goals, honor your charitable interests and make it easier to continue your legacy.

The Guide includes information about the benefits of giving from one's wealth, rather than from one's income. For example, giving a donation as part of an IRA's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) – called a Qualified Charitable Distribution – instead of by a check from a checking account means you won't pay taxes on those dollars as income even as you meet the RMD requirements when you reach age $70\,^{1}\!/_{2}$. Other giving vehicles and strategies are also discussed to plant charitable ideas.

As Mr. Buffet says, what you plant now sows the seeds for care in the future. Please accept this Guide as our gift and know that how you give now will provide shade—and hope—for countless lives in the years to come.

She likes to donate to Circle when she can, "to try to give back."




We love the Missouri Food Pantry Tax Credit! It's a win-win-win for our donors, Circle and the families we serve.



For our donors who contribute at least \$200 in monetary gifts,* we proactively prepare and sign the Form FPT that must be filed with state tax returns by April 15. We'll have them in the mail by the first week of February, ready for your tax preparer.

*While gifts given through a DAF, or donor-advised fund, do not qualify for the tax credits, establishing a DAF does offer you other tax benefits.
